Tune's Notes

I grew up the son of a preacher. "Church" has always been a part of my life – and a welcome one at that. But it hasn't always been educational.

Growing up, sermons were mostly thematic and doctrinal: "This is what we believe and this is why." Bible classes were focused on learn-

ing some facts, getting grounded in our orthodoxy, and (eventually) learning what I shouldn't do as a teenager.

It's all I remember. To all my Bible teachers, sorry. Perhaps I just was a poor student.

In any case, when I began preaching as an occupation I was 21 – a freshly minted graduate of a State university with a B.S. in Accounting and Finance. Could anyone have been more unprepared?

My first church asked me take over teaching Genesis. They were about half way through and had been studying it for three years. I decided I would take them through the Old Testament. I used Alfred Edersheim's Old Testament History as my resource material. Imagine my surprise when I got to Nehemiah and discovered to my horror that I was basically done and had left out 23 books of the Old Testament because I hadn't any notion of where they fit in the story (and didn't even know I was leaving them out!).

It's a horrible admission. What makes it worse is that if anyone noticed my blunder – no one said a word.

For the next thirty-nine years, I spent my time learning the story of the Bible, the themes of each book, their literary flow and place in the narrative. And along the way, I've been writing about what I've learned. This past week, ACU Press/Leafwood published my book *How to Read the Bible Without Getting Lost*.

If in any way you find yourself identifying with the plight of that beginning preacher, I really believe you will find the book helpful.

For the next few weeks, my articles are going to be a bit biographical but perhaps, in reading about this journey, you will find some direction for your own journey as a Bible student.

Resolution Runner: Run for Yourself John 20.1 - .8

Why do I believe? Why do I have faith in Jesus? Why am I following Jesus?

These are possibly the most important questions we can ask ourselves as

followers of Jesus. If we can't answer these questions do we actually believe? Are we actually following? Do we have any faith?

Early in our journey we may answer "because my parents believe." This is a typical answer for someone who grows up going to church. If you came to faith later in life and didn't grow up in a church environment you might answer "because the person I studied with believes" or "because my spouse believes." Initially believing because someone important to you believes is a great start. It gets you moving on your faith journey.

In John 20, Mary has gone to Jesus' tomb but finds it empty! She runs to Peter and John to tell them the news. They in turn hear her story and then run on their own to see. Once they see the empty tomb, they believe.

This story is similar to our own faith journey. We start believing because of the faith of others. Think of this as an umbrella of faith. We start by standing under someone else's faith umbrella but we can't stay here. Just like Peter and John start running because of Mary's report, we have to start our own faith journey and have our own faith!

In order for faith to be real in our lives we have to own it. We have to make it ours. We have to look into the empty tomb for ourselves and see that it is empty.

Farther down our faith journey, our answers to the "why" questions change from what someone else believes to what we believe. We start walking under our own umbrella of faith.

This is what we are exploring on Sunday Nights in the Upper Room Teen Ministry's Bible study for the next 2 weeks.


Prayer Sisters Program to Resume February 2

Jay & Piera Young Are Newest Missionaries Supported by Falls Church

The Missions Committee announces that the mission work of Jay and Piera Young in Italy and in the Ukraine is now receiving support from the Falls Church congregation.

Below is background about this couple and their work in these mission areas.

Jay and Piera Young celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on April 12, 2012, and virtually all of that time together has been dedicated to the work of the Lord, in this country, in Piera's native country of Italy and in the former Soviet Union Republic of the Ukraine.

It has been a journey of a lifetime for a young man from Bartlesville, OK, who was stationed in Naples, Italy, with the U. S. Navy. He was invited to worship services by the American missionary in Milan, and that is where he met his future wife.

Following their wedding in the Lord's Church in Milan in 1962, they came to the U. S. where they studied Bible and engaged in missions training for four years. During that time, their son **Steven** was born in Memphis. Their daughter **Lisa Young Swetnam**, a member here at Falls Church, was born in Abilene, TX, while they were completing studies at (then) Abilene Christian College.

They returned to Milan for a year then joined the work of Gerald and Bobbie Paden in Pisa. While there, Jay also completed a Master's in Education through Boston University at two U.S. military installations. He also engaged in graduate

studies in Theology at the Waldensian Theological Faculty in Rome.

After 10 years in Pisa, the Youngs moved to northeast Italy and to churches of Christ in the cities of Pordenone, Belluno, Conegliano Veneto and Monfalcone.

Returning to central Italy - Tuscany - in the early 1980's, they worked in Florence and Pistoia. Jay also conducted multiple Gospel meetings and leadership training series throughout the country. He also began doctoral studies in Italian Language and Literature at the University of Florence.

They moved to Arlington, VA, from 1986 to 1992, and during that time they added work in the Ukraine, and helped established the Lord's Church in Odessa. Piera was instrumental in beginning a Ukrainian child-assistance program entitled "A Child to Love." Sponsors from the U. S. and Italy help bring faith and obedience in Christ to many of the young people in several cities in Ukraine.

For the last two decades, they established The European Christian Institute of Continuing Studies, which has

brought serious Biblical Studies to cities in Italy. Palermo is one of those cities, and it now has one of the largest churches of Christ on the continent of Western Europe, with an evangelist trained at the Institute. Another education program is the Italian

Scuola Biblica Online (Online Bible School), for which Jay is one of the main teachers.

They also served the Rockville (MD) congregation from 2002 to 2013, while continuing the mission work in Italy and Ukraine.

They retired last year and moved to Florida, but for two people who have spent their lives in bringing souls to Christ, retirement didn't last long. And now they have committed themselves to fulltime mission efforts in their two beloved countries, with extended preaching and teaching trips twice each year.
