Tune's Notes

Sometimes, as I read through the Psalms, I am struck by comparisons between them that I've never seen before. It happened this week as I read Psalms 76 and 80.

Psalm 76 describes the city of God (Jerusalem in the Old Testament, the Church in the New Testament) as

a ground so protected by God that citizen and enemy alike recognize the Lord's shielding presence. In fact, His care is so obvious that those who are not God's people come to worship Him and share in His holy city. There is a subtle message here: In days of triumph, God must be exalted by our lives so that everyone who hears of our blessing will want to serve the God who made it possible.

Psalm 80, on the other hand, was written by the same fellow – Asaph – and it describes God's city as a smoldering hulk vulnerable to any passerby.

It's tempting, and easy, to draw the conclusion that Israel's misfortune in Psalm 80 was due to some sin meriting the judgment of God.

But be careful. There is no mention of transgression there and no request for forgiveness.

As loved as we are, sometimes life hands us an unexplainable misfortune. It may be from God to punish us. It may be from God to test us. It may be from God to strengthen us. It may not be from God at all! We may not know where it is from or why.

Asaph's message, I think, with these two Psalms, is that life is not constant. There are mountaintops of glory and valleys of despondency.

In either situation, the faithful remember to go to God – in thanks, or for deliverance. Wherever we are, our thoughts must never be far from the one who makes everything possible.

Dark Power of Sin

"The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are healthy, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness."

- Jesus (Matthew 6.22 - .24)

A few weeks ago there was a dramatic event in my neighborhood. During the serving of an eviction notice by the sheriff's department, a barricade situation developed. This lasted almost 12 hours. In the end no one was injured and the resident was taken into custody.

But as this unfolded I began to learn more about the man in the house. At one point he had done well but recently had fallen on hard times. During the hard times the utilities had been turned off to the house and he moved into the garage/shed behind the house. From the outside his world seems to have shrunk, becoming smaller and smaller until all that was left was him.

While these aren't all the facts, it caused me to reflect on the power of sin in our lives. Sin draws us into ourselves. Sin feeds on our selfishness. So when outside help comes - instead of accepting it graciously, we barricade ourselves in our little houses. Instead of allowing the light to come into our lives, we prefer to stay in the darkness and hide from the truth.

The Good News of Jesus is that His redemptive power can take our dark, selfish and broken lives and make us something new. No longer do we need to hide our sins but rather we confess them. No longer do we need to hide our troubles, but rather we bear them together.

I don't know the entire story of the man in the barricade situation. I still think about him and pray for him. I hope one day he can find healing. I also pray and hope that we will all accept the hope and healing Jesus offers.
