Some of you, though probably very few, will remember recording artist Sandy Posey. She started out as a pop singer (moved later to country) and had her first million selling single when she was 21 (1966) – but it never charted higher than #12 nationally.

I remember her (and don't ask me why because I don't know) for a another song that sounds more country than pop (also didn't get higher than #12). It had these lyrics:

I take it back, I didn't mean it
Please forget what I just said.
I take it back, I'm sorry
I must have been out of my head.

In fact, every time my mind tells my tongue to be still, and my tongue doesn't listen, that song comes to mind. Every. Time.

The song came to mind for another reason recently. WTOP was interviewing the creator of a new "smart phone" app (android only) that allows you to unsend/recall text messages.

"Interesting," I thought, as Posey's song came to mind again. Interesting that is until we got to the "how it works" section of the interview. You have to set a timer for your messages. The longest you get is 60 seconds. So . . . if you text someone, and it takes longer than a minute for you to have sender's remorse, you're still out of luck.

Perhaps it might be better simply to wait 60 seconds before actually writing – or at least sending – that angry, sarcastic, caustic, or embarrassingly romantic text in the first place.

All this brings to mind some other words – from the Bible this time: First, Proverbs 10:19 – "When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise." Second, from James in the New Testament: "My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires" (1:19-20). In 21st century language, we might add everyone should be "slow to text" or even "comment on Facebook."

As you can see we covered a lot of material in a short amount of time!


I want to thank all my adult chaperons who came and made this weekend a success. I also what to thank the teens and students who came, learned and had a good time.



Henry Gutierrez, Nicaragua

Henry Gutierrez has preached for the congregation in Juigalpa, Nicaragua (about 100 miles east of Managua) since 1989. In addition to his ministerial duties, he conducts evangelistic campaigns, and works with various other congregations in the area of Juigalpa. He and his wife, Rosa, have been married since 1991 and have three daughters Kimberly, Eunice & Aurisol.

The pictures here display the benevolence ministry work of the congregation in Juigalpa, Nicaragua. Falls Church contributes some funds for this work.

The two photos to the right show Christians before and after a visit to a local jail. Photos are not allowed inside the facility, so they took one outside. One purpose of this visit was to bring a donation of medicines for the prisoners, and Henry is shown with the guard who accepted the medicine.

The other three photos show a group of members from Juigalpa as they prepared and distributed food to the elderly members of the congregation. Many of these members suffer from chronic illness and can't take proper care of themselves.
