Tune's Notes

Our daily Bible readings this past week have brought us to the end of the book of Psalms.

I hope you noticed that the book of Psalms is really five books:

Book 1 – Psalms 1-41

Book 2 – Psalms 42-72

Book 3 – Psalms 73-89

Book 4 – Psalms 90-106

Book 5 – Psalms 107-150

The last Psalm of each book ends in a very similar way: with a praise to God.

"Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel (41:13 and 106:48).

"Praise be to his glorious name forever" (72:19 and similarly in 89:52).

The final psalm (150) ending the final book of psalms is devoted in its entirety to praise.

God is to be praised everywhere (vs. 1).

He is to be praised because He is great (vs. 2).

He is to be praised with everything we have (vss. 3-5), and He is to be praised by everything that has breath (vs. 6).

Notice that with this Psalm, God is not praised because he has done something special for us. Had God never done one thing for us, He would still be deserving of praise because He is, quite simply, in and of Himself, great, and worthy of praise.

At the end of the Bible, creatures in heaven and on earth fall before the throne of God and give Him praise day and night.

The statement and example of scripture is simply this: The more we know about God, the closer we get to God, the more worship will be all we want to do.

In fact, it will be all we can do. In a very real sense, our spiritual proximity to God is revealed by our interest and participation in worship.

Impoverished Widow Displays Great Faith; Part 1 of Report of Habtu Zemech's Recent Trips to Ethiopia

Sister Zenebech has almost nothing of material value. She is a widow, and two of her daughters are deceased. She retired from her job as a janitor at the church-sponsored school for the deaf in order to bring up her last two daughters and nine grandchildren.

Her brother, a dentist, contributed to her support, but died 9 years ago, leaving her destitute.

In addition, she experienced a severe health crisis and eventually underwent triple bypass heart surgery.

She cannot afford to care for her grandchildren and to pay for her medications.

In the eyes of the world, Sister Zenebech would be considered impoverished, perhaps even helpless.

But she doesn't see things that way.

Habtu Zemech, a member and deacon of the Falls Church congregation, is the director for "My Neighbors Foundation," a not-for-profit organization funded primarily by Falls Church members. It provides financial assistance to some of the neediest people in Habtu's native country of Ethiopia. He met Sister Zenebech through the foundation's help with school fees and supplies for her grandson Beruke.

"What makes her story such a testimony," Habtu said, "is not the fact that she is poor, sick or lost one daughter to AIDS and another to TB, while both were in their 20's or that she lost her brother who was the family's only source of income. Instead, it is the way she exhibits steadfastness and faithfulness now as she has all her life."

A member of the Church of Christ in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, for 40 years, she became unable to walk to worship service. So she petitioned the Addis Ababa congregation to send brethren to minister not only to her but also to some of her neighbors in the area.

And now Sister Zenebech ponders "Who knows if God is doing this to me in order for the church to spread beyond where it was for the past several years."

Talk about a Christian viewpoint!

Sister Zenebech's health issues began several years ago when she was diagnosed with heart disease. However, she wasn't told how serious her situation was and due to lack of funds was unable to follow up. As her health deteriorated and she became weaker, a doctor from Canada, Dr. Mike, who had worked with Sister Zenebech's oldest daughter, arranged for her to see a cardiologist. In turn, that doctor determined that she would need a triple bypass operation. Dr. Mike also paid the bill of \$15,000 for the surgery which was performed in Addis Ababa.

"My Neighbor" now assists her with medicine as well as school supplies for two other grandsons, Dagmawi and Kaleb.

Habtu added, ""Her story reminded me of Paul's message to the Romans, 'I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing iwth the glory that will be revealed in us' [Romans 8:8]. Regardless of what happened to her or where she is in life, it seems our sister put her hope where it needs to be. Her story should encourage us all to look beyond where we are in life and faithfully await that glorious day."
