Imagine you are sitting at your cello about to play one of your favorite pieces of music. Imagine an audience of thousands sitting before you, anxiously waiting to hear you play. Imagine you have practiced hard for weeks getting ready for this moment.

Imagine you know you are going to sound horrible!

You are out of tune!

Living with two cellists in the house, I know that the idea of playing out of tune is horrifying to them. There is no way a cellist wants to practice out of tune and absolutely NO WAY they want to play for an audience out of tune.

This desire to play in tune is not limited to cellists. All the musicians I know want their instruments to be in tune. It is important for the notes to sound right. It is important for the music to sound right. If they can't play correctly most musicians don't want to play.

They spend the time learning how to play the notes correctly and they spend the time making sure their instruments are in tune.

Now imagine you walk into your office, school or home ready to be a Christian.

Imagine your coworkers, fellow students, friends and family are watching how you act.

Imagine you went to church on Sunday, prayed that morning and read your Bible.

Are you going to "play" your life in tune with Christ or out of tune with Christ?

If musicians are horrified at the thought of playing their instruments out of tune, how horrified should we be when we live out of tune with Christ?

One of the Winterfest speakers offered us the same challenge. The challenge is that we walk the way Jesus leads us. The challenge is to live in tune with the music of Christ. In addition to this challenge, he offered us ways to get in tune. We will look at some of those in the next few weeks.
