On Sunday mornings the Upper Room Teen Ministry has started a series studying the Book of Genesis

We began at the beginning by exploring the poetic telling of the creation in chapter 1 and the narrative telling (chapters 2-4) that covers the creation of humanity, our rebellion against the LORD and the consequences of that rebellion.

I prefer to call "the Fall" a rebellion because when we choose to disobey the LORD GOD we are trying to be our own gods! When the LORD GOD creates humanity we are created in HIS image or likeness. We were created like GOD. The serpent's lie to us is that if we eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil then we will become like god. What we are offered is to be our own god - no longer obedient to the LORD GOD.

In eating of the fruit of the Tree we rebel, but our rebellion is a failure. We thought we would be in charge, but we quickly discovered that sin took over. There was a promise of wisdom but instead we found foolishness.

Our rebellion against the LORD GOD is a sad story. It is a story that is not over but one we are still living out. Each day we have a choice. We can try to be our own gods or we can be submissive to the LORD GOD. Ironically when we submit ourselves to the LORD GOD we discover who we were truly created to be.

One thing we should not miss in reading this story is that over and over again the LORD GOD shows us grace. When we are exiled from the Garden we are given clothes. When Cain is on the edge of sin the LORD GOD warns him. Even after Cain kills his brother the LORD GOD provides protection.

The LORD GOD always extends grace with punishment.
